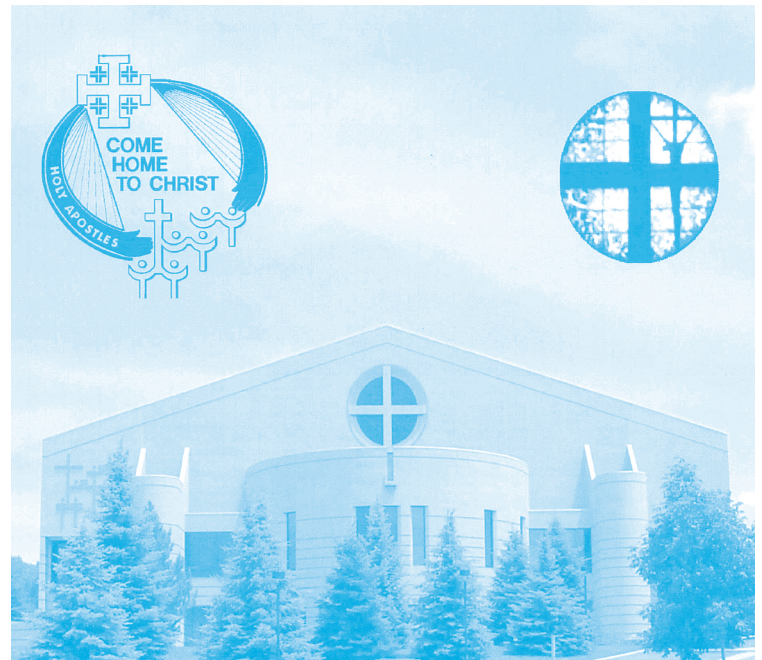

Three young children are chosen to represent the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary and Joseph. They are known as the Invited Ones or the Saints. They are dressed in Biblical costumes and the one representing Joseph knocks on three doors, asking for food and shelter for his family. At each of the first two doors when he knocks he is told there is no room for them. At the third door, where the altar is set, they are welcomed in. The table is set and the food is ready. These three little children are served first and then all the rest of the guests. Food remaining is given to the poor along with the donations.

Fr. Paul's Ponderings

"I will never forget you!" "No one can serve two masters!"

"Father in heaven, form in us the likeness of your Son and deepen his life within us. Send us as witnesses of gospel, joy into a world of fragile peace and broken promises. Touch the hearts of all men with your love that they in turn may love one another." (Today's alternate opening prayer}

Jesus continues in today's' gospel to show us how to live the beatitudes. Simply but profoundly Jesus confronts us: "No one can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."

"Mammon" is understood through the centuries as anything or anyone to which or whom we are so attracted as to deny our master. It usually points to "riches."

So, why would any follower of Christ become more attracted and dedicated to "riches", which could pass away over night? (As we in our nation know how rapidly so many, lost so much!)

How is it possible to not desire to align all "our" (as if we owned these gifts of God!) possessions, with the mission of Christ to our families and to the good of others?

Isaiah reminds us that if our Mother can never forget us, how is it possible for our Creator to forget us? Our Creator and Creating God, in the person of Christ and the Holy Spirit are always with us and in us for one another

This is mystery, the mystery of God's immeasurable love for us! And St. Paul reminds us today how others should see us: "Brothers and sisters: Thus should one regard us: as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. Now it is of course required of stewards that they be found trustworthy."

Jesus reminds us today not to be worry-warts about tomorrow. If we are truly his disciples, we will be open to the Spirit who provides for us from his presence in others. To be "trustworthy" means to do all can with what we have as Christ's disciples, to embrace the Holy Spirit's empowering life within us to be and do all we can with the gifts we have in developing our gifts and spending our gifts in love and mercy for others...allowing others to see in us God's abundant love. No small challenge!

The 7th preface in ordinary time which opens the Eucharistic prayer reads: **"So great was Your love that You gave us Your Son as our redeemer. You sent Him as One like ourselves, though free from sin, that You might see and love in us what You see and love in Christ. your gifts of grace, lost by disobedience, are now restored by the obedience of Your Son."**

Hearing the Scriptures today, and praying this Eucharistic Preface, invites us again to relive the memory of Christ in our lives! May we understand what we pray, believe what we pray and do what we pray...that our loving Father may see and live in us what He sees and loves in His Son!



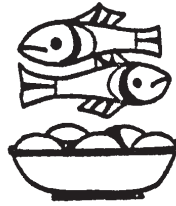
