### Season of Biblical Hospitality

1 Peter 4:9 challenges us to “be hospitable to one another without complaining.” The *biblical* hospitality alluded to in this passage is far different from our definitions that equate hospitality with entertaining. *Merriam Webster’s Collegiate Dictionary* defines hospitality as either “given to generous and cordial reception of guests” or “offering a pleasant or sustaining environment”. As people of faith we are challenged to move beyond these basic definitions. Looking to scripture for our definition of “biblical hospitality”, we find the Greek word “*philanthropia*” used, meaning “love of human beings” and “kindness”. Biblical hospitality removes the fear of “differentness” and abides in love and gives glory to God. Biblical hospitality is a bridge where the stranger, or even someone we might consider the enemy, can become a friend in Christ.

### Halloween/All Saints/All Souls

The Church has always honored those who have died in their faith. In the early Church, the martyrs were especially remembered. The feast of All Saints began in the 4<sup>th</sup> century as the feast of All Martyrs and was originally celebrated the first Sunday after Pentecost and then later on May 13—during the season of joy after the Resurrection. Resurrection is the light in which we see all the faithful who have died, especially those who witness to Christ. In 1835, the feast date was deliberately changed to November 1 to Christianize the existing pagan time for remembering the dead—to bring light to the darkness and hope to the most basic of human fears. The first Christians were heirs to the Jewish custom of praying for the dead and offering sacrifice for them as part of an emerging Jewish belief in the resurrection of the dead. Today’s Christians sometime forget that by in the time of Christ, many Jews, especially the Pharisees, had a well-developed belief in the resurrection of the dead, which included trust that the prayer of the living could benefit the dead. For the first 1,000 years of Christianity, there was no collective memorial for All Souls. Relatives and lived ones were remembered at Mass on the anniversary of their death, or until they passed out of living memory. But by the 7<sup>th</sup> century, monasteries were celebrating an annual Mass for all deceased of their order, and idea which spread to the laity. About 1048, an influential abbot chose November 2<sup>nd</sup> to commemorate All Souls because it was an obvious companion date and extension of the Feast of All Saints. Both days are reminders that all of us, living and dead are united in a living communion with Christ and one another. Remember to tour the *WALK WITH THE MARTYRS*, today after the noon Mass, and bring your Candle of Remembrance for a deceased member of your family back to Church for display during the month of November.
