Fr. Paul's Ponderings

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Have in you the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 2:1-11)

How have we encouraged another in Christ? Brought to another compassion and mercy? Participated in the Spirit? Thought like Christ thinks?

How often is our attitude the attitude that is in Christ?

How St. Paul has invited the Philippians to be and what to do is the same invitation to us.

When we fail in our relationships with each other, demanding that our passing needs be met immediately, mammon illness is present in our spirit. We so often discourage others rather than encourage. How often do we bring compassion and mercy to another?

Are we aware of our call to participate in the Holy Spirit?

In today's Gospel we see Jesus teaching through a story about two sons. At Dad's command to the first son to go into the vineyard, he said "no Dad, I will not!" But afterwards he changed his mind and went.

The second son when commanded said: "yes Dad, I will", but never followed through. And Jesus asks: "Which of these two sons did his will?"


And they all answered: The second son.

Formation Essentials:

Pope Presents Eucharist as Solution to Social Despair

A person who can kneel before the Eucharist and receive Christ in Communion must be attentive to the needs of his neighbor and ready to share his goods with others, says Benedict XVI. "A Eucharistic spirituality is a real antidote to individualism and egoism that often characterizes daily life," the Holy Father stated. He proposed that responsibility in community life is born from the Eucharist, such that the poor, sick, and needy are placed at the center of social development. "To be nourished by Christ is the way not to remain foreign and indifferent to the fortunes of our brothers, but to enter into the very logic of love and of gift," the Pope said. "He who is able to kneel before the Eucharist, who receives the Lord's body cannot fail to be attentive, in the ordinary course of the days, to situations unworthy of man, and is able to bend down personally to attend to need, is able to break his bread with the hungry, share water with the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned," he continued. Benedict XVI proposed a Eucharistic spirituality as an antidote to individualism, saying that it leads to giving relationships a central role in life, beginning with family relationships. A Eucharistic spirituality, he continued, is also at the heart of a Church community that overcomes divisions. As we celebrate the Eucharist, we are a gathering of all kinds of people who are there for all kinds of reasons. It is not for us to judge each other's motivation. What is essential is that all of us are embraced by the unconditional love and mercy of God and by the magnanimity of Jesus, whose eternal "yes" liberates us to live in the Spirit. Living with the Spirit, compels us to live in a world that can be quick to judge and slow to respond to the needs of others.
