## Fr. Paul's Ponderings

### "If Today You Hear His Voice, Harden Not Your Hearts."

**BECAUSE I AM A CATHOLIC...**I'm called in every Sacrament that I receive, in every Scripture I read, to ask the question: *"whose voice do I hear... the voice of Christ or my own voice? Whose voice do I follow? Christ's voice or my voice? When does my voice and behavior reflect Christ's voice and behavior?"*

It's rather easy to look out into the world of politics and point fingers at anyone in any political party and wonder if they are Christian in name only. What about ourselves? When we look into the mirror do we sometime wonder where we may be "hardened in heart?" Do we have the courageous humility to admit this?

Even as I write this for you, I find myself asking myself the same questions...what is it in my heart that needs conversion? And who needs to experience my conversion?

Today I ask all of you to take time to look into the mirror, to see where it is that that your heart is in need of conversion to Christ, to His way and life, and mission.

And, if you have not yet responded to our Bishops plea for your financial help, please respond to the amount that you are able.

Let us pray for each other to *"hear his voice, and not harden our hearts."*

### Jesus Still Speaks to Us



*They were spellbound by his teaching, for his words had authority.*

The authority of Jesus' teaching refers to the power and dignity with which he spoke. It is a power beyond the right Jesus had to teach in the synagogue. It acknowledges his personal call to offer a "new teaching." Jesus bravely enters into this God-granted authority: he exerts power over unclean spirits and heals in the synagogue on the Sabbath. Jesus clearly has a sense of his

authority. He knows who he is and what he is about, and his listeners are amazed. They ask, "What is this?" We also ask, "What is this?" especially when we hear all the rhetoric that is on the television and read on the internet. We can ask the same question—by whose authority do you subscribe? We hear Moses' advice about heeding the words of God's prophets and consider our own call to be prophet. The psalmist encourages us to keep our hearts soft and open to God's word. Paul would be delighted if we all claimed our God-granted power and dignity to live the life to which we have been called. In doing so, we would discover our own authority. When Jesus spoke in the synagogue, it was new, and it was with authority. Today, Jesus speaks to us in word and sacrament. It is still new—and he still speaks with authority. *My soul waits for you, in YOUR WORD I hope* (Psalm 130:5). Listen to Him! (Brenda Merk Hildebrand, *Living With Christ*, 2012)

#### Families Share Your Story

#### Reading 1 Reflection Deut 18:15-20

In this reading Moses assures the people that God will raise up from among their descendants "a prophet like Moses." This prophet will speak what God commands. He will be a true spokesman for God. Like the people of Israel, we too must be concerned about who can teach us the true will of God. We must realize that often there are false prophets around us, advising us badly. We should turn to Christ and the Church for true teaching of what is God's will for us, what is right and wrong, just and unjust.

**Discussion Question:** How will you be a prophet to those around you?

#### Reading 2 Reflection 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

The community in Corinth, was, it seems, always worrying about something. They wrote to Paul with their questions, and Paul tried to teach and reassure them. In this letter he suggests that people look at their lives to see how they can devote themselves to God. Whatever our future state in life as married or unmarried people, we should begin now to give the Lord the most important place in our lives. If we do, everything else will fall into place.
